

Don't use high-pressure water blasters on asbestos

It's illegal to use a high-pressure water blaster on asbestos-containing materials such as asbestos cement roofs, fences and walls.

Water blasters destroy the surface of asbestos-containing materials spreading asbestos fibres widely and putting the health of you and your neighbours at risk.


Businesses and homeowners who use high-pressure water blasters on asbestos-containing materials face heavy fines and clean-up costs at an average of almost \$90,000.




Super six asbestos roof



If your home was built before 1990 it's likely to contain asbestos. If you're not sure, don't risk it—get it tested before any works start.


